AISD Food Pantry and Food Deliveries

Since May, New World volunteers have been working in partnership with Arlington ISD Families in Transition and Rush Creek Church to bring weekend food to North Arlington families in need. What began as a stopgap ministry of delivering food to a few dozen families in need has been extended throughout the

school year as AISD students continue to be learning from home this spring semester

You can help support this vital ministry in three main ways:

- 1) Volunteer to deliver food on 1 or 2 Fridays a month. Each week 7-8 volunteers are needed to take food from the church to 2-4 families in the area. We would love to have enough volunteers on a rotation so each would only need to deliver food once or twice a month. Volunteers wear masks and deliver to front porches so there is minimal contact. You are welcome to try it out once to see if you like it!
- Volunteer to organize groceries. Three weeks a month New World provides a bag of groceries for each family. We need 1 or 2 volunteers who can come in to the church on Wednesday afternoons to sort through donations.
- 3) **Donate items.** Since we feed 25-27 families a week, the food need is great. Mostneeded items include: Jelly, Peanut Butter, Pasta, Sauce, Canned Meats (chicken breast, tuna), Rice, Beans, Soups and Canned Goods.
