


#### February Book Club: "Finding Meaning: The Sixth Stage of Grief" by David Kessler – Feb. 28

The New World Safe Social Distancing Book Club is ready to resume for 2021! If you love to read books but do not have time for a lot of meetings on your calendar, this is the perfect book club for you.

#### How it works:

Each month we select a book to read on a variety of subjects. If one interests you, join in! You borrow or buy the book to read on your own in whatever format you prefer, then we get together for an hour to discuss the book and how it applies to our faith.



**February's book is the highly recommended "Finding Meaning: The Sixth Stage of Grief" by David Kessler.** On a personal level and a cultural level, we all endure grief in various ways. In the season of Lent, we look at death and dying in a new light.

A summary from Amazon: "In 1969, Elisabeth Kübler-Ross first identified the stages of dying in her transformative book *On Death and Dying*. Decades later, she and David Kessler wrote the classic *On Grief and Grieving*, introducing the stages of grief with the same transformative pragmatism and compassion. Now, based on hard-earned personal experiences, as well as knowledge and wisdom gained through decades of work with the grieving, Kessler introduces a critical sixth stage: meaning.

Kessler's insight is both professional and intensely personal. His journey with grief began when, as a child, he witnessed a mass shooting at the same time his mother was dying. For most of his life, Kessler taught physicians, nurses, counselors, police, and first responders about end of life, trauma, and grief, as well as leading talks and retreats for those experiencing grief. Despite his knowledge, his life was upended by the sudden death of his twenty-one-year-old son. How does the grief expert handle such a tragic loss? He knew he had to find a way through this unexpected, devastating loss, a way that would honor his son. That, ultimately, was the sixth stage of grief—meaning. In *Finding Meaning*, Kessler shares the insights, collective wisdom, and powerful tools that will help those experiencing loss."
