

"During the Great Awakening of the 18th century, John Wesley famously quipped that the key to the spiritual revival in England and America was the organization of Christians into various small groups, then called select societies, class meetings, and bands. The purpose of each was to pursue holiness together."¹ We are standing at the threshold of another Great Awakening.

This post-pandemic awakening is one of people who have come to realize that God is most important in their lives and they need to reconnect, as well as those who discovered a need for God and faith in their lives and are searching for a place and a people to fellowship and grow alongside. We have the greatest opportunity for "each one brings one" by inviting others to a community of faith than ever before.

But people are not just looking for something else to do, they are looking for meaning and purpose. Wesley discovered this search in the first Great Awakening and created societies, classes and bands as a clear way of purpose. "Bands were voluntary cells of people who professed a clear Christian faith and who desired to grow in love, holiness, and purity of intention...Gathering in groups for spiritual accountability can help foster faith and growth in Christlikeness."²

John Wesley developed Sunday school for a specific purpose. To teach the children who were working in the mines and factories how to read and write. Before child labor laws there was little regard for these children. Sunday school has a different purpose today. Today, we are helping children learn about Jesus and the stories of the Bible.

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We are helping children, youth and adults gather in spiritual accountability to foster their faith. We are creating **bands of people** invested in both their journey of faith and in the journey of others.

Beginning, August 15th, we will return to two in-person worship services and one on-line service for three services at New World. Between the two in-person services, we will be changing our verbiage from Sunday school to **BAND Meetings**. BAND at New World will stand for **"Being A New Disciple"**, emphasizing we seek to renew our faith walk and deepen our purpose through study, accountability to one another and Jesus Christ, and grow in our discipleship.

New BANDS will continue to be created as we move forward; at times both on Sundays or during the week. We have discovered that BANDS can meet on site or on-line and we want to encourage creativity and flexibility going forward with BAND meetings. We will have Children and Youth Band Meetings, and then our current classes will have the same name with Band Meeting replacing "Sunday school class". Ex: Inquirer's Band Meeting.

I am excited about all the possibilities this will create. Countless studies have proven that it is easier to create a new Band than to add to existing Bands – as people often drop out because they do not have the same history and relationships as those already in the group. Let's work together for growth at New World in the coming season to create several new Bands of people desiring a deeper walk with Jesus.

What's Project Transformation?

Project Transformation is a summer reading literacy day camp that's all about the "Three C's" - Children, College Students and Churches! It helps underserved elementary age **children** while also developing awesome Christian leadership in **college student interns,** hosted at a local United Methodist **church**!

What is our role?

New World serves as a Partner Church with First UMC Bedford. That means FUMC Bedford hosts the camp at their facility all summer, and we help by volunteering as reading helpers, providing intern and kid food support, and especially praying for and encouraging our partner site! *This is one of the most important mission ministries we do all year!*

How can you help?

Our biggest need: We need reading volunteers to spend a couple of hours a day reading with some great children during the mornings only on the week of July 12-15. *Per Project Transformation Central Texas's rules, volunteers must be age 13 and up and be willing to show proof of COVID-19 vaccination. It's so exciting that we'll get to read with the kiddos again this year!*

Times: There is a mandatory volunteer orientation **Sunday, July 11 3:30-4:30PM.** Volunteers are needed in the **mornings Monday-Thursday July 12-15** (volunteers are needed if you can volunteer 1 day up to all 4 days!) **Location:** All reading and training happens at First UMC Bedford, 1245 Bedford Road, Bedford

How else can you help?

We need all sorts of supply support - school supply donations, backpacks, special treats for interns, notes of encouragement for the interns, supplies for intern lunches and weekend groceries for PT families. Pastor Erin could also use volunteer help with organizing donations and recruiting volunteers.
