

Numbers and statistics are interesting to me. While I realize that numbers and statistics can be skewed or selected to prove a point by individuals, but if recorded with honesty and integrity, they can tell a great deal about something. For instance, when I step on the scales (which is both a dreaded and sobering moment) the number I am given is a truth about what is happening in my life. And often, I do not like the number I see.

But, let's be honest...that number tells me and my doctor what needs adjusting, addressing or when it goes in the right direction, what needs to be celebrated. The same is true in the life of the church. Every church in the Central Texas Conference is required to report specific numbers that help measure the vitality of a given faith community.

Currently, we are asked to report: Worship attendance in-person, worship attendance online, professions or re-dedications of faith, small groups that meet, giving each week and a narrative story about what our church has been doing during the week to make disciples and serve in God's world. These reflect the health of a church.

As you might expect, the numbers for worship in-person are varying because of COVID. Our average over the last 3 months is: 201-online and 105-in person. Since August 15th with offering 2 services each Sunday, our numbers are higher. Our professions of faith are consistent, yet our small groups are rising as we return to meeting both on-line and in-person. Our giving is slightly down and we must always honor our commitment to God, but our narrative tells the story each week of how we are reaching out to love and care for our neighbors through missions.

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We are a church with strong ties to mission and outreach and our narrative is that we will always care for those in our midst to the best of our ability in the face of all that is going on in the world.

So, as we look to the future and grow our numbers in all areas of the life of the church, we call upon every person who loves this church - and the work of this church - to share the Good News that New World continues to thrive and seeks to grow with every person who journeys alongside this family of faith.
