Every week of the school year, we deliver 55 weekend snack bags containing 12 specific, nutritious snacks each to our two adopted elementary schools. That's 660 food items every week, 2640 per month! The food we provide is a tremendous blessing to school children who may not have enough food to get through the weekends, and it is a lot of moving inventory for our food pantry.



During the break between semesters, I would love to stock up our food pantry for the spring! You can help by donating any of the following items:

- Drinks: Bottled Waters, Shelf-stable milk, 100% Juice boxes/pouches
- Breakfast items: Oatmeal pouches or cups, Individual Cereals, Breakfast Bars
- **Healthy Snacks:** Granola Bars, Sandwich Snack Crackers, Baked Crackers such as Cheez Its, Goldfish, Pretzels
- **Small Meals:** Chef Boyardee Individual Cups, Macaroni and Cheese Cups, tuna snack on the run kits
- Fruits: Applesauce, Fruit Cups with no sugar added
- Desserts: cookie packs, gummy fruit snacks

A Letter From Sarah Henson, Director of Student Ministries

After three and a half years at New World, my season here as the Director of Student Ministries will come to a close on January 2nd.


CARING FOR GODS HOUSE WITH LOVE

 has also been installed to track the temperature in the attic.
- Our parking lot tower lights are currently out (the square lights are ours, the round ones
 are Oncor's). We are in the process of getting bids to fix the ones that we own.
- Creative Nightscapes has repaired our office entrance parking lot and tree lights.
