CONNECT and GIVE QR CODE

We have discovered some things that have now become a convenient "norm" in the world during the last 24 months. Just to name a few... things like: Home delivery of groceries, Door Dash©, wider options for online shopping, more outdoor dining, virtual learning, streaming movies, tele-doctor visits and receiving services off a QR



Code. (Quick Response Code) Some were beginning to rise in popularity in 2019 and the last two years have pushed them into a mainstream center stage. And several of these make life much easier.

New World has moved from paper registration of attendance, which is more time-intensive to enter and people were not signing in, to signing in through a QR CODE which places information in a centralized location in the office files. We have been "testing" various ways to make this more accessible and we admit, we are still in the "best way to make it easily accessible" stage. But, the QR CODE allows us to do several things in one step. It has made us better stewards of time and staffing.

It is important that you enter your attendance because we are accountable for keeping accurate records. These weekly reports are part of our year-end "check-out" process with the Conference and vital to measuring our success as a viable church. It also lets us know if you have been absent for several weeks, so we can contact you to make sure you are not ill or have moved.

Currently, we have no way of knowing who is present and who is not, because we have not yet fully returned to in-person worship and we do not have everyone using this new technology yet. We will get there – and are currently looking at having the QR CODE located on the pew backs.

We ask you to turn on your smartphone, click on the camera – and point it at the QR CODE and it will scan and open up with several options to choose from. If you would like a short tutorial, please ask a staff member (or one of our youth) to give you a "how to." The QR Code is located on screens throughout the building and just before you enter the sanctuary.

Every week of the school year, New World volunteers deliver 55 weekend snack bags containing 12 specific, nutritious snacks each to our two adopted elementary schools. That's 660 food items every week, 2640 per month! The food we provide is a tremendous blessing to school children who may



not have enough food to get through the weekends, and it is a lot of moving inventory for our food pantry.

If you'd like to support this ministry through donations, here are some specific items we need:

- Breakfast items: Oatmeal pouches or cups, Individual Cereals, Breakfast Bars
- Healthy Snacks: Granola Bars, Sandwich Snack Crackers, Baked Crackers such as Cheez Its, Goldfish, Pretzels
- Small Meals: Chef Boyardee Individual Cups, Macaroni and Cheese Cups, tuna snack on the run kits
- Fruits: Applesauce, Fruit Cups with no sugar added
- Desserts: cookie packs, gummy fruit snacks

Donations can be brought to the donation box near the front doors.


How it works: if a book looks interesting to you, read it on your own & then meet us on Zoom to discuss it together.
